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(What is the meaning of Life?)



What is the meaning of life? How can purpose, fulfillment, and satisfaction in life be found? How can something of lasting importance be achieved?

So many people have never stopped to think about these important questions. They look back over the years and wonder why their relationships have fallen apart, and why they feel so empty, even though they may have done what they set out to do.

I once watched a documentary about an athlete who had reached the top of his sport and was asked what he wished someone had told him when he first started to play his sport. He said, "I wished that someone would have told me that when you reach the top, there's nothing there." Many goals reveal their emptiness only after years have been wasted in their pursuit.

In our human culture, people pursue many things, thinking that in them they will find meaning. Some of these pursuits include business success, wealth, good relationships, sex, entertainment, and doing good to others. People have testified that while they achieved their goals of wealth, relationships, and pleasure, there is still a deep void inside, a feeling of emptiness that nothing seemed to fill.

The author of the biblical book Ecclesiastes describes this feeling when he says, "Meaningless! Meaningless! Utterly meaningless! Everything is meaningless" (Ecclesiastes 1:2). King Solomon, the writer of Ecclesiastes, had wealth beyond measure, wisdom beyond any man of his time or ours, hundreds of women, palaces and gardens that were the envy of kingdoms, the best food and wine, and every form of entertainment available.

He said at one point that anything that his heart wanted, he pursued . And yet he summed up "life under the sun"- as life lived as though all there is to life is what we can with our eyes and experience with our senses is meaningless.

Why is there such a void? Because *God* created us for something beyond what we can experience in the here and now. Solomon said of *God*, "*He* has also set eternity in the hearts of men; yet they cannot fathom what *God* has done from beginning to end" (Ecclesiastes 3:11). In our hearts we are aware of the "here and now" is not all there is.

In Genesis, the first book of the **Bible**, it tells us that *God* created mankind in *His* image (Genesis 1:26). This means we are more like *God* than we are like any thing else. It also tells us that before mankind fell into sin and the curse of sin came upon the earth, the following things were true:

1) *God* made man a social creature (Genesis 2:18-25); 2) *God* gave man work (Genesis 2:15); 3) *God* had fellowship with man (Genesis 3:8); and 4) *God* gave man control over the earth (Genesis 1:26). What is the importance of these things? *God* intended for each of these to add to our fulfillment in life, but all of these (especially man's fellowship with *God*) were harmfully affected by man's fall into sin which resulted in a curse upon the earth (Genesis 3).

In Revelation, the last book of the **Bible**, *God* reveals that *He* will destroy this present and heavens and announce the eternal state by creating a new heaven and a new earth. At that time, *He* will restore full fellowship with redeemed mankind, while the unredeemed will have been judged unworthy and cast into a lake of fire (Revelation 20:11-15).

The curse of sin will be done away with; there will be no more sin, sorrow, sickness, death, or pain (**Revelation 21:7**). We will have come full circle: *God* created us to have fellowship with *Him*, man sinned, breaking that fellowship, *God* restores that fellowship fully in the eternal (always existing) state. To go through life achieving everything only to die separated from *God* is useless.

The real meaning in life, both now and eternity, is found in the restoring of our relationship with *God* that was lost with Adam and eve's fall into sin. That relationship with *God* is only possible through *His Son Jesus Christ* (Acts 4:12; John 1:12; 14:6). Eternal life is gained when we no longer want to continue in sin and *Christ* changes us, making us new creations, and we rely on *Jesus Christ* as Savior.

The real meaning in life is found not only in accepting *Jesus Christ* as savior, as wonderful as that is, it begins when a person start to follow *Christ* as his disciple, learning of *Him*, spending time with *Him* in *His* Word, talking with *Him* in prayer, and walking with *Him* in obedience to *His* commands.

If you are not a Christian (or perhaps a new believer), you might be saying to yourself, "That doesn't sound very exciting or fulfilling to me!" But *Jesus* made the following statements: " *Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light" (Matthew 11:28-30). "I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full" (John 10:10). "If anyone would come after me, he must deny himself and take up the cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his for me will find it" (Matthew 16:24-25).*

What all these verses are saying is that we have a choice. We can continue to seek our own way into emptiness, or we can follow *God* and *His* will for our lives.

(Grateful)

A grateful heart sees each day as a gift. Thankful people focus less on what they lack and more on the privileges they have. A grateful heart is like a magnet sweeping over the day, collecting reasons for gratitude.

Gratitude gets us through the hard stuff. To reflect on our blessings is to rehearse *God's* accomplishments. To rehearse *God's* accomplishments is to discover *His* heart. To discover *His* heart is to discover not just good gifts but the *Good Giver*. Gratitude always leaves us looking at *God* and away from dread. It does to anxiety what morning sun does to valley mist, it burns it up.

Holding on to feelings of thankfulness boosts our immune system and increases blood supply to our heart. Daily guided exercises or the habit of keeping a weekly gratitude journal can increase our alertness, enthusiasm, and energy, and improve our sleep. People who describes themselves as feeling grateful tend to suffer less stress and depression than the rest of the population.

If you were asked the question, "What are you most thankful for?" what would your answer be? It didn't take me long to think about my answer. I am most thankful for *God's* love. *He* loved me so much that *He* gave *His Son* to die for me.

I was lost with no way to merit *God's* favor. I had nothing to offer *God*, for all things are *His*. I had no righteousness in myself, "But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousness are as filthy rags; and we all do fade as a leaf; and our iniquities, like the wind, have taken us away" (Isaiah 64:6)

God in **His** great love, reached down to where I was and gave *His Son*, the precious *Lamb* of *God*, to be my sacrifice. So today, first and foremost, I am thankful for the love of *God*. But *God*, who is rich in mercy, for *His* great love wherewith *He* loved us, even when were dead in sins have quickened us together with *Christ*, and have raised us together, and made us sit together in heavenly places in *Christ Jesus*: That in the ages to come *He* might show the exceeding riches of *His* grace in *His* kindness towards us through *Christ Jesus*. For it is by grace you are saved through faith; and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of *God* (Ephesians 2:4-8).

Take a moment today to stop and enjoy life. We are all moving on the fast track. Schedules are filled to the max with appointments and activities. We are so busy doing our list that we do not even realize if we actually like what we are doing, when was the last time you stopped to notice which bird in your yard was chirping so beautiful? Do you even listen to them for any length of time? What about the stars at night, or the flowers blooming, or a butterfly passing by?

When was the last time you really looked at your children? Noticed their eyes? Time stops for no one, and it is moving quickly. "Then my soul will rejoice in the *Lord* and delight in *His* salvation (Psalm 35:9).

It's easy to spend our lives worrying and obsessing over the problems of life. It's also easy to overlook a blessing in times of need, or forget to be thankful when troubled times have been put to rest. Be sure you don't become one of the nine lepers, who were so happy to be cured they forgot who cured them. I encourage you to spend time remembering what **God** has done in your life.

I believe *God Loves* to hear praises of a thankful heart! As a mother, when I have done things for my children I like to hear them be thankful. I like to know that they appreciate what I have worked hard to give them or teach them. It makes me feel good inside when I see them being thankful that I have sacrificed my time, effort, and desires to make sure they are growing up healthy and happy.

On the other hand, if they act spoiled, ungrateful, or just "take for granted" the things I have strived so hard to do for them, that makes me frustrated, disappointed, and sometimes even a little angry.

I believe that *God* is no different. *God* is our spiritual parent. He is our creator. *He* is our *Father*. *He* sacrificed *His* most prized possession, *His* only begotten *Son, Jesus Christ*, so that we (the world) might be able to make heaven our home. *He* gave us the gift of salvation. *He* gave us hope. *He* gave us love. *He* provides our every need, both physically and spiritually. *God* gives us everything we need and *He* LOVES to hear us be THANKFUL for what *He* has given! Let us enter into *His* gates with "THANKSGIVING"!

(The Feast in Jerusalem)

Summer was over, and the cooler days of autumn had come. On the hillsides around Jerusalem stood groups of booths or huts made from branches. During the Feast of Tabernacles, the Jews lived out of doors. These booths were their only shelter. Visitors came from every part of the land for the feast.

On the first day as people talked together, they wondered if *Jesus* would come to the feast to teach them. Some told of things they had heard *Him* say. Others talked about *His* miracles.

As the people talked and asked about *Jesus*, they expressed different opinions. Some said, "*He* is a good man." others replied, "No, *He* deceives the people. Only in their small groups did the people talk about *Jesus*. No one dared to speak of *Him* publicly. They were afraid of the Jewish rulers.

About the middle of the week, *Jesus* came to the temple and taught. *His* enemies thought this would be a good time to catch *Him*. They sent men to listen to *His* teaching. These men would find fault with what *Jesus* said and accuse *Him* before the rulers.

Jesus answered, "My teaching is not mine, but his who sent me."

When the officers heard this, they asked one another, "Where could *He* go that we would not be able to find *Him*? Would *He* go to the Jews who live abroad? Would *He* go to teach the Gentiles?"
